Probable Cause for Arresting a Christian

GALATIANS 3:1-11

Know then that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham. And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed." So then, those who are of faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith. For all who rely on works of the law are under a curse; for it is written, "Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them." Now it is evident that no one is justified before God by the law, for "The righteous shall live by faith." (Galatians 3:7-11)

Is there enough probable cause to convict you for being a Christian? It was evident in Antioch that they were guilty of following Christ. Acts 11:26 says, "and when he had found him [Paul], he [Barnabas] brought him to Antioch. For a whole year they met with the church and taught a great many people. And in Antioch the disciples were first called Christians."
Will probable cause lead to an arrest? Would people say of us, they are guilty of following Jesus. See Acts 16:16-24; Acts 17:5-6; Acts 4:18-21 Acts 7:54-60.

Excavations in the city of Ur where Abraham lived, reveal the fact that Abrham was not a wild desert sheik, but an educated, wealthy, sophisticated citizen of the world, a man living in and ostensibly partaking of a state of culture and opulence little dreamed of by the person who is unfamiliar with the ancient civilizations of the past. Abrham was no ignoramus with a gullible faith. With all his cultural background, and in spite of it, he saw that much of that with which we have to do, is taken upon faith, including the way of salvation. Those who exercise a like faith to Abraham, share with him in the same salvation which he received from God." -- Word Studies in the Greek New Testament, Volume 1, Eerdmans, page 94.
